

- Do NOT pledge more than you are comfortable with. Remember you can always give more than you pledged.
- Write the check for your pledge first each month, you will find that you will have funds left at the end of each month. (Thanks to Cynthia Riley for sharing this many years ago!)

Your pledge will be used to help create the budget for the year. While the budget is a roadmap for our spending each year it is important that we have a good idea of what funds we will have so we can allocate our resources correctly.
